The Invictus Games Vancouver Whistler 2025

- The Invictus Games Vancouver Whistler 2025 presented by ATCO and Boeing, is an international adaptive sporting competition for Wounded, Injured, and Sick (WIS) service members and Veterans.
- The Invictus Games Vancouver Whistler 2025 will take place from February 8th –16th 2025, with adaptive sporting events taking place in Vancouver and Whistler.
- Over 500 competitors from up to 25 nations will compete in eleven sports, including six winter sports for the first time in Invictus Games history.
- The Invictus Games Vancouver Whistler 2025 is the seventh Invictus Games, and represents the second time the event has been hosted in Canada, following the Invictus Games Toronto 2017.

Mission

- Our mission is three-fold:
 - 1. **Deliver a world-class Games:** Deliver a best-in-class international sporting competition for Wounded, Injured, and Sick (WIS) service members and Veterans.
 - 2. **Shared Journey of Recovery:** Create a culture in which competitors and their families are valued, respected, and receive support.
 - 3. **Deeper Social Purpose:** Through our actions, demonstrate our commitment to reconciliation, inclusion and ESG.

Values


- Our values are:

Four Host First Nations

 The Invictus Games Vancouver Whistler 2025 will be held on the traditional territories of the Four Host First Nations of Lilwat7úl (Lílwat), x^wməθk^wəyəm (Musqueam), Skwxwú7mesh (Squamish), and səlilwətał (Tsleil-Waututh). We are committed to ensuring they respond to Canada's Truth & Reconciliation Commission Calls to Action, and ensure Indigenous protocols are respected in all aspects of the Games. The creation of our branding is a great example of this partnership in action.

Broadcast

• The Invictus Games Vancouver Whistler 2025 will be available to watch on broadcast and online meaning that members of the public can support from across Canada and from the comfort of their own home, or on a personal device anywhere.

Our Sports

- The Invictus Games Vancouver Whistler 2025 will host eleven sports six of these will be adaptive winter sports (for the first time in Invictus Games history) and will include Alpine Skiing, Snowboarding, Biathlon, Cross-Country Skiing, Skeleton and Wheelchair Curling. Other sports include Indoor Rowing, Sitting Volleyball, Swimming, Wheelchair Basketball and Wheelchair Rugby.
- Competitors can participate in more than one sport, with a maximum of eight sports for any one competitor.









 Team announcements for all Nations' teams are typically made leading up to the Games. The Team Canada announcement will be made July 10th and the team will be made up of competitors from across Canada.

Our Venues

- The Invictus Games Vancouver Whistler 2025 will be hosted at seven venues across Vancouver and Whistler, these include:
 - 1. Vancouver Convention Centre
 - 2. Hillcrest Centre
 - 3. UBC Aquatics Centre
 - 4. Rogers Arena
 - 5. Whistler Blackcomb
 - 6. Whistler Olympic Park
 - 7. Whistler Sliding Centre
- Vancouver Convention Centre will serve as the main 'hub' of the Games. It will host the Wheelchair Basketball, Wheelchair Rugby, Indoor Rowing and Sitting Volleyball competitions.
- Hillcrest Centre, home to the Vancouver Curling Club, will host Wheelchair Curling.
- UBC Aquatics Centre will host the swimming competitions in its 50m pool.
- Whistler Blackcomb, North America's largest ski resort, will host the Alpine Skiing and Snowboarding competitions on Whistler Mountain.
- Whistler Olympic Park will host the Cross-Country Skiing and Biathlon competitions.
- Whistler Sliding Centre will host the skeleton competition, located above Whistler Village on Blackcomb Mountain.

Volunteers

• Volunteers will play a significant role in supporting the operations and delivery of the Invictus Games Vancouver Whistler 2025. This includes both pre-Games and Games-time roles. We plan to engage 100 volunteers pre-Games and 1600 Games-times volunteers. Registrations have now closed and interviews for applicants are underway.









Family and Friends

 The Invictus Games community recognizes the important role of family and friends and their shared journey of recovery alongside the competitors. Every Invictus Games offers a unique opportunity for Family and Friends to join the competitors during Games time. Each competitor at the Invictus Games Vancouver Whistler 2025 will have the opportunity to select two individuals to accompany them to the event – they can be family or friends.

Sustainability and Legacy

 The Invictus Games Vancouver Whistler 2025 has set a goal of supporting seven legacy programs:

1. New Sports Hybrid Format

The innovative addition of six new adaptive winter sports - Alpine Skiing and Snowboarding, Biathlon, Nordic skiing, Skeleton, and Wheelchair Curling. It is the evolution of the Games, and provides a new path on the journey of Veteran rehabilitation and recovery.

2. Year-Round Adaptive Sports

Opportunities to access adaptive sports year-round, sharing global best practice, capitalizing on the physical and psychological benefits of regular recreational activity, and providing the foundation for future winter hybrid games.

3. Mental Health - Friends and Family Role in Recovery Support

The opportunity for friends and family to use their experience and gain Psychological First Aid Certification.

4. Veterans' Employment

The successful and sustainable transition into civilian employment, including Veteran work experience at the Games. Raising awareness of new employment areas for Veterans and improving transition experience with online support and mentoring.

5. Diversity and Inclusion

Advancing reconciliation and renewed relationships with Indigenous peoples. Raising awareness of Canada's Indigenous Armed Force and Veterans; building on wider international platforms for diversity and inclusion.

6. Adaptive Sports Research

Identify which aspects of the Winter Hybrid Games have the greatest positive impact on all participants.









7. **ESG**

A commitment to ESG tracking and transformation in every aspect of 2025, and being accountable to measurable delivery against these goals. Establishing an ESG strategy as a step forward for IGF, and providing an impactful framework for future Games.
